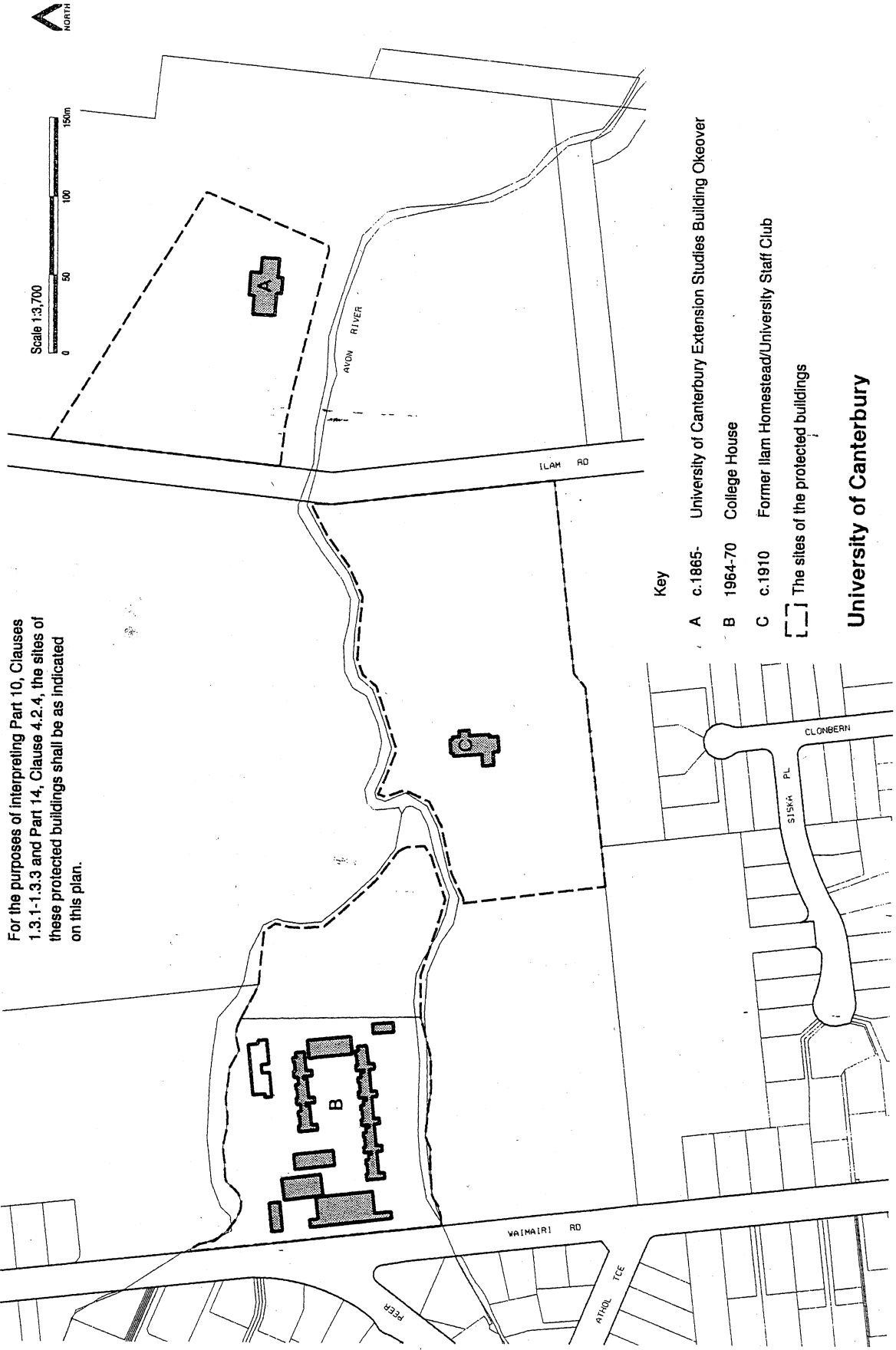


## New map - Appendix 2a - Heritage buildings on sites containing multiple buildings

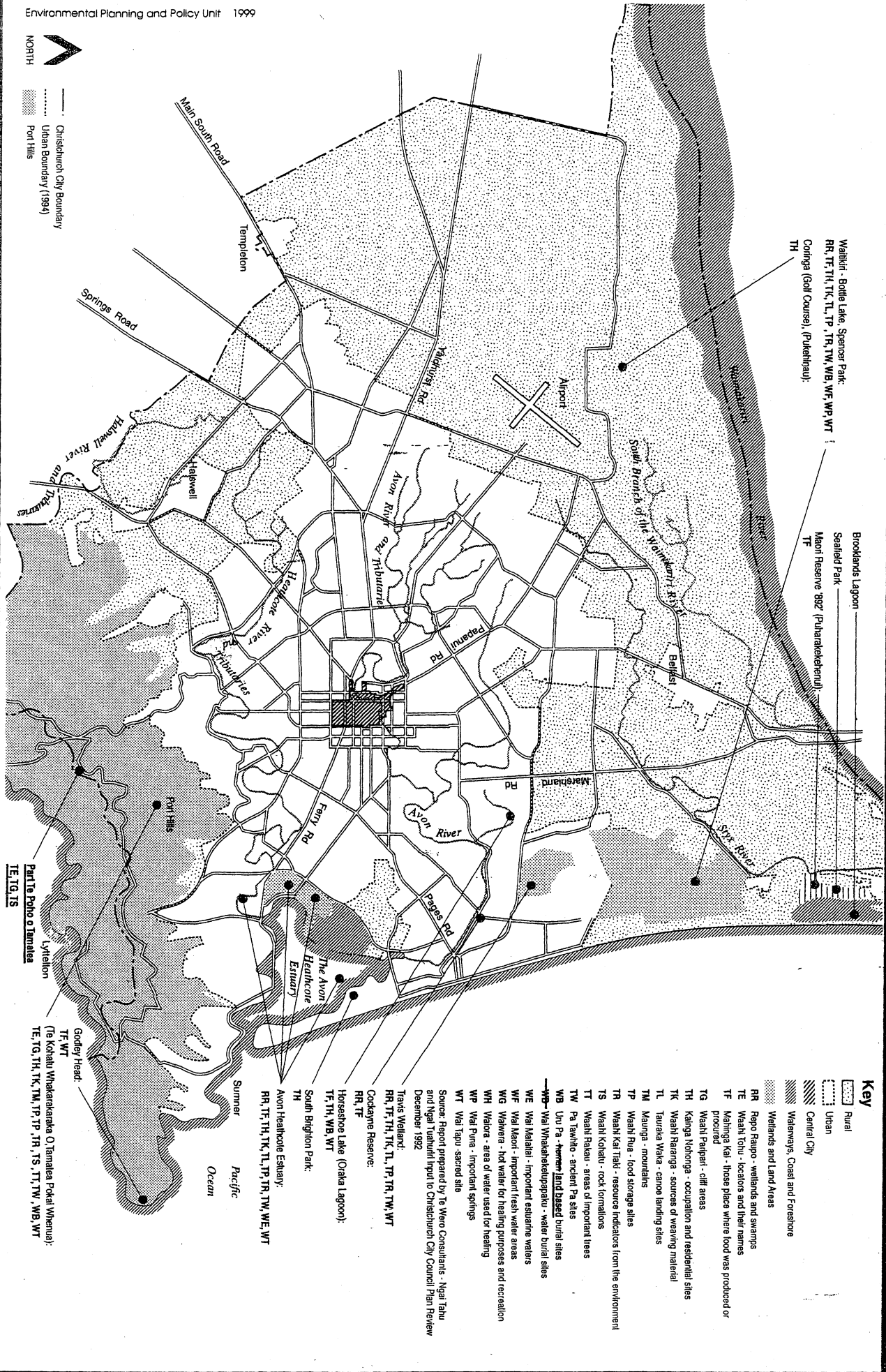
